Course: MSS011 Speed and Accuracy Development I

Credit: 6 Quarter Hours **Method of Delivery:** eLearning, arranged (eL arr.)

Course Description:

In this developmental course students complete a theory review and practice various drills and timed writings to assist them in reaching their required skill level in machine shorthand speed and accuracy. Credit not applicable toward any degree programs.
