PSY 140 - Introduction to Psychology

Credit Hours: 4 quarter hours Method of Delivery: ONLINE

Course description: (IAI S6 900)

Approved for Transfer by the Illinois Articulation Initiative

This is a class on the fundamentals of human psychology. Using a scientific approach to the study of human behavior, this course examines and integrates physiological, intra psychic and social/behavioral perspectives on human thought and behavior. Major units include: biological bases of behavior, sensation and perception, motivation, learning and memory, life span and aging issues, personality, and social psychology.

Participation Requirements/Policies and Procedures:

- 1. This is not an arranged class. Besides doing individual text readings, text questions, and assigned projects, each student will be involved with group questions/discussions that you will answer in the Discussion Forums. These are assigned through the weekly schedules.
- 2. Every week there will be many opportunities to log on with regards to turning in assignments, providing weekly feedback, engaging in group discussions, and reading any updated weekly assignments. Always review everything in the weekly folders to get further details on projects and assignments.
- 3. All assignments are expected to be turned in on time. This is important with an eLearning course because it encourages group cohesiveness. For this class, the eLearning week is Monday, noon Monday, 8am. Therefore, all assignments given for a particular week will be due by 8:00am the following Monday (except for the last week). This does not mean you have to wait until Day seven to turn in completed assignments. I encourage you to turn them in as completed. If there are problems, I expect to hear from you prior to the due date.
- 4. Work from weeks 1-6 will not be accepted after midterm, for any reason, even for late points. During weeks 1-6 and weeks 7-11 work will be taken

late up to one week past their due date if you have contacted me...however, late points will be applied.

- 5. Group discussion points can only be earned during the week the discussion is posted. Students receive partial points (15/25) for one original complete posting. Students receive the remaining points for thoughtful feedback given to at least one other class member. Writing "ditto", "I agree with you", or "good point" will not count as "thoughtful feedback". No make-ups are allowed. Additionally, proper spelling and grammar is expected. Points may be taken off if there are excessive mistakes.
- 6. Once an assignment is submitted to the drop box that is what your final grade for that assignment will be based on. I will not accept other parts to a given assignment through email once it is submitted to the weekly folder drop box. Please review assignment guidelines carefully and submit all of it at one time to the correct drop boxes.

Methods of evaluating student performance: Your grades from each assignment go directly into the grade book in Joule when submitted to the appropriate drop box. Please review grades by going into the gradebook for this class.

Project Information:

Article Summaries:

Select 2 articles pertaining to current aspects of psychology. You will be using one article per article summary, not 2 for each summary. These cannot be fiction. Suggested sources include: **Psychology Today**, Time, Newsweek, Chicago Tribune, Journal Star, US News and World Report. I suggest using **Psychology Today**, either from our library or online, for the best selection of credible articles. If you do utilize an article from the Internet, please make sure it is the original work, not a summary of an article or a blog. Choose articles not less than 1 ½ pages that are written by credible people (doctors/scientists) and backed up by research.

2-2(1/2) pages <u>total</u>. The paper will be double-spaced, contain 12 size letters, and use Times New Roman font style, with one inch margins. Article summaries <u>MUST</u> be done using Word.

The <u>summary</u> should include the cited source. 60% should be a basic overview of what the article was about. Remember to quote if necessary and cite correctly.

The other 40% should be your <u>analysis or reflection</u>. This would include things like your thoughts and feelings, why you chose this article, what touched you personally, would you recommend it to a friend, what questions it left you with, and do you think it seems credible? Make sure to include the analysis part of your report - **this is a substantial part of your points**.

Weekly Summaries:

A weekly summary consists of simple paragraphs summarizing your experience with this class, discussions, text material, etc. It is my way of getting feedback from you each week to see what you enjoy most, what you are having trouble with, and/or are learning the most. This is not meant to be time consuming or lengthy in nature.

2-3 well-developed paragraphs is appropriate and required. Let me know what areas of the class you learned most from, which topics were most helpful to you, anything you are struggling with, and/or anything you found particularly interesting. Personal comments are always welcomed as well. Please complete these each week in the appropriate drop box. Please use correct grammar, punctuation and spelling. **Use 12 size letters, Word, Times New Roman font style and double space or points will be deducted.**
