<u>Participation Requirements</u>:

Students are required to complete the Workbook assignments and take announced Quizzes and Tests as documented in the Course Outline. Workbook pages will be checked in class, and

workbook completion will be a portion of the final grade. Realtime Reporting students will be required to write the word lists vocabulary in realtime and complete any necessary dictionary building. Word lists are provided and writing possibilities are discussed. Dictionary building will be checked weekly.

Policies and Procedures:

- 1. Students must be familiar with Realtime Reporting Department Policies and Procedures.
- 2. Dictionary Assignments or Spelling Tests (pre-theory or non-RR students) 10 percent of final grade Realtime Reporting students who have taken Theory I, II, and III will be required to write on their machines the weekly terms as well as an additional list of vocabulary words assigned each week and to complete any required dictionary work. These students must hand in printouts of written terms in order to receive credit. Otherwise, students will be given ten weekly spelling quizzes for this portion of the cumulative grade.
- 3. Weekly Workbook Assignments 20 percent of final grade
- Quizzes 30 percent of final grade There will be 9 quizzes given as reflected in the Course Outline.
- 5. Midterm 20 percent of final grade There will be a comprehensive midterm test.
- 6. Final 20 percent of final grade There will be a comprehensive final.

Methods of Evaluating Student Performance:

Students must complete Workbook Assignments, Quizzes, Midterm Exam, and Final Exam. Dictionary Building (Realtime Reporting Students only) will be checked by the instructor and will affect the student's final grade.
